After The Beatles rocketed to fame, little Gabe Cinquegrana was like many young boys: He wanted to be in a band. With an Airline guitar from Montgomery Ward, he started taking lessons, later learning to play by ear.

Nearly 60 years and many bands later, Gabe is still making music, and often at Ferris Hills!

The Newark native and his wife of 53 years, Debbie, moved into their new apartment this past summer from East Lake Road in Canandaigua. It was in that neighborhood that the couple had met Charlie Lane, who has been singing since he was 7.

The two men found their voices matched harmonically, and especially with Everly Brothers tunes. They joked that they should call themselves The Elderly Brothers, and the name stuck. After all, Gabe said, it's "old music by old guys." That old music also includes Elvis, The Beatles, The Eagles, and more.

The Elderly Brothers' first official gig was at the VA Medical Center in Canandaigua, where Gabe – whose career was in finance and computer sales/service – volunteered for many years.

"I was very nervous because I didn't know what the reaction would be, but we were just thrilled," he said. "It was the best thing in the world."

Charlie agreed. "If you can bring a little happiness into someone's life, music will do it," he said, adding, "It's fun and it keeps you young!"
