Resident Offers 'Writing with Spirit and Listening with Heart'

An author and longtime lecturer at the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) is leading a six-week writers' workshop for fellow residents at Ferris Hills.

Barbara "Mac" MacCameron was on the English faculty at RIT. She is also the author of "The Statue of Liberty Wore Nikes" anthologized in *The Runner's High*.

After living on a hilltop between Honeoye and Canandaigua for many years, Mac moved to the Tidewater region of Virginia, returning to the Finger Lakes in 2019 to live at Ferris Hills. She has offered Shakespeare presentations and also led a poetry workshop, but the workshop that started Sept. 17 is the first writing course. Called "Writing with Spirit and Listening with Heart," it is derived from workshops she taught through Writers & Books in Rochester.

Doris Ellenbogen is among those who signed up. She'd never taken a writing class before, but respects Mac so much that she wanted to give it a try. As it turns out, her first assignment – writing about a photo of her choice – was well-received by others in the class. She enjoyed listening to what they came up with, too.

"There are people who have done this before and are used to writing, and those of us who have never done it," she said.
